Do you know how hard it is to navigate an international airport after receiving a call that you have been chosen by a birth family? It's almost impossible. Finding your luggage, finding your car, and driving two hours home seems like the most difficult tasks. Don't get me wrong, it was great to struggle with simple things. Especially with the wonderful news we had just received.

If we rewind about 8 months, Sarah and I had started planning to adopt. We contacted Wyoming Childrens Society and they were very welcoming. They walked us through the steps and we began the process. Being our first time adopting, we had a tremendous amount to do. So, we got to work. Biographies, home studies, and everything else that goes into this were done as soon as we could. The excitement was sometimes overwhelming, dreaming of what the future would hold for us. Once everything was finished, the hardest part set in. The waiting. Not knowing. Hoping for a phone call. The catch is that you have to carry on with life. We talked daily about the possibilities and probabilities. The "what ifs," if you will.

As we discussed the different scenarios, we decided to pass the time with a vacation. During this vacation, I remember adoption being in the forefront of our minds. Breakfast, lunch, through dinner, and walks on the beach. Then one day during this vacation, Sarah received a phone call to ask if we wanted our family profile to be shown.

As I was just listening to one side of the call, I'm fairly sure Sarah said yes before whoever was on the other line could finish. Of course, we agreed and then went back to waiting. This was our only topic of conversation. Emotions were intense for the remainder of the vacation.

Boarding the plane to return home was stressful. We hadn't heard anything yet and knew that we wouldn't have cell reception for several hours. Hopefully, they wouldn't call until we landed. Once again, thoughts were flowing endlessly. When we landed, phones went back on as soon as possible, and we had a voicemail. Shuttling off the plane, Sarah was calling. We had been chosen by the birth family. Exactly a month later, our oldest daughter, Shelby, was born.

The story doesn't end there. We have two sons as well. Milo and Bohdin. Milo has been a character since he was born. Happy, energetic, and loves life. Bohdin is the youngest. He's our troublemaker, jokingly. He is also full of life, curious, and just a fun kid to be around. All three make Sarah and I frustrated when they do something they shouldn't, they make us cry when we can't take away the pain, and they remind us daily how blessed we are to be parents. They are everything we dreamed of.

Our three kids have been adopted through Wyoming Children's Society. All three had very unique adoption experiences and through these experiences, we have gained many more friends and family. Most have been touched by adoption or are curious about adoption. They are the important pieces of the puzzle that allowed us to become parents. Our children have more grandparents and relatives because of adoption. Some we see yearly, some are through social media, and others stop by monthly to see them. The relationships built with birth parents and birth families have been essential and are truly a blessing to Sarah and I, as well as the kids. Adoption has been a wonderful experience, and Wyoming Childrens Society helped make it possible. One of the best quotes I have seen; "We didn't give you the gift of life, life gave us the gift of you." This couldn't be more fitting for our family.

### **Our story, your story, their story** by Laura Shields



I am honored to share some of our story with you all. We are the Shields family and adopted our children at birth through WCS(the most amazing agency and people!). Our children are now 14, 11 & 9 years old! My husband says "adoption feels as natural as breathing" and he is absolutely right. I cannot imagine any scenario other than the one we chose for our family. I remember holding them each for the first time. I felt this overwhelming sense of awe and gratitude that God worked in so many people to bring about that precise moment. At the time of birth, I naively believed that was the biggest moment in our adoption journey. In many ways it was, for my husband and I. What I am learning is that for our children, it was just the beginning of their journey. As they grow, each stage brings its own set of questions and understanding of their story. And it is just that: THEIR story. They will each have a different perspective of what it feels to be adopted at each stage of their life. I imagine the same is true for their birth parents.

Some of our kids are biologically related, some are not. This is often hard. To be honest, there is one question that I always have difficulty giving a graceful answer to. That question is "are any of them related?" The answer is "Yes, they are related to each other. If what you're asking is, are they biologically related, then, yes, two of them are."

Some of our kids have contact with their birthmother. One does not. This is often hard to understand. However, she recently said "I've never met my birth parents but hearing all the stories and stuff makes me think that they are great people."

We celebrate our family of five. We celebrate our differences. We celebrate our similarities. It is OUR story and it has times of joy, and times that are hard to understand, but it is OURS!

Last year our middle daughter Cody came home and said someone asked her what it felt like when she was adopted. She responded, "I don't remember, I was just a baby" to which the other child was stunned. She said "they think you have gone to an orphanage or something and so they ask what it was like."



When we asked our kids recently what does adoption mean to you, we received a variety of responses:

"Being in a family." "You can have more opportunities in life to be a better person and to do harder things." **Tucker**, *age 9* 

"Adoption doesn't mean that your birth parents didn't want you, it's because they wanted you to have a better life." "Adoption is a way you can have more opportunities." **Cody**, *age 11* 

"Adoption is not something to be ashamed about." (DEFINITELY NOT...It's YOUR story and it's beautiful!) "Adoption gives you more chances to be a better person." **Emma**, age 14

Our oldest Emma has also had similar stories and says "a lot of people think that kids come from a foster home. It's hard to explain how you were adopted when you were born and how it's different from foster care." There are many different sides to adoption. My hope is that those of us connected with adoption, and if you are reading this newsletter, you are, can take those informal moments to educate our communities on all the sides of adoption. There are children, birthparents, adoptive parents, and adoption agencies. There are different types of adoption as well, domestic, international, at birth, older children, foster and much more. It is **OUR** story-share it!

I know this article rambles around a bit. But isn't that true for our adoption stories? The adoption symbol at the top is a clear and efficient representation of the child, the birthparents, the adoptive parents and the love shared by all. But that is not the whole story. The adoption story belongs to us all, and each story has its own unique perspective. Embrace your story, share it with those wanting to hear it, and hold it close to your heart where the most precious of feelings are kept.
